THE NURSE AS PART OF THE TRAUMA TEAM

This is a 16 hour course designed to introduce the nurse to resuscitation of the trauma patient within the first one to two hours post-injury. Lectures are supplemented with clinical practicum in trauma assessment (with moulaged victims), use of equipment, diagnosis and stabilization.

This course is recommended for nurses who:

- practice with physicians trained in Advanced
 Trauma Life Support.
- receive major trauma in their departments.
- are recent to emergency nursing; or
- desire reinforcement/review of initial trauma care.

(Although this course parallels ATLS in content, it does not provide instruction in performing advanced life support skills).

Certificates will be awarded upon completion of the course.

ADVANCED CARDIAC LIFE SUPPORT PROVIDER
