Steve has authored over 35 peer-reviewed publications and book chapters on emergency and trauma care. He serves as Trauma Section Editor and Peer Reviewer for the Journal of Emergency Nursing, Associate Editor for the Journal of Special Operations Medicine, and Peer Reviewer for multiple other journals. Steve has lectured nationally and internationally in emergency & trauma care, disaster/mass casualty response and preparedness, & prehospital medical care. Steve serves on numerous state and national trauma committees.

Cathlyn Robinson is a Registered Nurse and is the Vice President of Nursing Operations for Emergency Medicine at the Robert Wood Johnson Barnabas Health system in New Jersey. She has an interest in Emergency Department systems, trauma nursing, Emergency Nursing education, advanced emergency care, and nursing leadership and mentorship.
